Become a Natural Resource Professional

Are You Eligible?

The **Association of BC Forest Professionals (ABCFP)** is the registering and regulatory body for BC's forest professionals, including Registered Professional Foresters (RPFs), Registered Forest Technologists (RFTs), as well as Associate Members and Special Permit holders. You must be a member of the association to practise professional forestry in BC.

To become an NRP, you must first become a Trainee NRP (TNRP) or conditional NRP.

To be eligible you must have graduated from one of the programs listed below:

- University of British Columbia's Bachelor of Science (BSc) in Natural Resource Conservation (May 1999 May 2005) or Bachelor of Science (BSc) in Natural Resource Conservation, Science and Management major (May 2006 to present);
- Thompson Rivers University's Bachelor in Natural Resource Science (May 1997 to present);
- University of Northern British Columbia's Bachelor of Natural Resource Management (BNRM) in Wildlife and Fisheries (May 2001 to present); and
- University of Northern British Columbia's BNRM in Outdoor Recreation and Conservation (May 2008 to May 2013)

Benefits of Membership

Once you have become a member of the ABCFP as an NRP, you:

1. Are eligible to practise certain aspects of professional forestry in BC, as described on the Natural Resource Professional page of the website (<u>http://www.abcfp.ca/entering_the_profession/career_options/natural_resource_professionals.asp</u>);

- 2. Enjoy right to title and right to practise under the NRP designation;
- 3. Are a member of the largest forestry association in Canada;
- 4. Have access to association resources and services;
- 5. Are eligible to make award nominations;
- 6. Have the opportunity to comment on and provide input on various professional matters including the direction of the ABCFP; and
- 7. Have access to group discounts for insurance, car leases, memberships and more.



Application Process

Application received in the ABCFP office.

Step 1:

Eligibility to enroll is determined.

Application is accepted and is verified for completeness.

Step 3: Articling date is set and application is sent to the board of examiners and council for approval.

if approved,

Step 4: Applicant is granted a member status as a TNRP or

conditional NRP..

once a member,

Step 5:

TNRPs must complete the 24 month articling, professional development requirements and pass the professional ethics exam.

Conditional NRPs must complete the professional development requirements* and pass the professional ethics exam.

*Note: Exemption from this particular requirement is possible if applicants provide a proof of completion of the professional ethics and obligations and professional reliance workshops through their current professional organization.

upon successful completion of the above requirements,

Step 6:

Member is approved by council and is granted an Associate Member status as an NRP.

If not complete, the application will be placed in a pending file and the applicant will receive an e-mail detailing what is missing.

If not approved, the registration department will work with the

applicant to see if deficiencies can be addressed.

If these requirements are not met within the allotted timeframe, the member may be removed from the association's register.

Applicant Checklist

This checklist will help you ensure your membership application is complete and accurate. Your application package must contain all forms, except for your official transcripts, together in one package. DO NOT SUBMIT FORMS SEPARATELY. Mail completed applications to the registration department. FAXED OR DIGITAL FORMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Step 1: All applicants for membership must submit:

1. Application for Membership

- Have you completed all three pages in full?
- Have you signed your Application for Membership?

2. Official Transcripts

A transcript or letter is **ONLY** official if it is an original document issued by the relevant academic institution, states that your degree has been conferred and is received by the ABCFP in its original sealed envelope. Your official transcripts is the only component that should be submitted separately. Please contact the registration department for further guidance.

Have you asked the academic institution to have your official transcripts for all relevant degrees conferred to be sent directly to the ABCFP?

3. Work History or Up-to-Date Resumé

- Have you included and signed your completed Work History or an up-to-date resumé?
 - Does it include all of your forestry or natural resources related work and volunteer experience?

4. Indictable Offence Declaration

Have you completed and signed your Indictable Offence Declaration?

5. Confidential Character References

- Have you obtained two Confidential Character References?
- Have they been sealed in an envelope and signed across the flap by your references?

6. Application and Membership Fees

Refer to the fees page of the website.

- Have you enclosed two separate payments, one for your application fee and the second for your membership fee?
- Have you included all applicable taxes? Your membership fee will not be processed until you have been approved for membership.

Step 2: Submit additional information:

If you are applying under the Trainee Natural Resource Professional route of entry, you must also submit:

1. Articling Agreement

- Are you and your sponsor aware of your obligations?
- Have you signed the Articling Agreement?
- Has the Articling Agreement been signed and sealed or stamped by your sponsor?

2. Confidential Sponsor Report

- Have you obtained a Confidential Sponsor Report?
- Has it been sealed in an envelope by your sponsor and signed across the flap?

If you are applying under the Conditional Natural Resource Professional route of entry, you must:

- 1. Request an e-mail or letter confirming that you are a member in good standing from the professional organization (Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of British Columbia; the College of Applied Biology British Columbia; the British Columbia Institute of Agrologists) with whom you are registered and have it sent directly to the association at <u>admissions@abcfp.ca</u>.
- 2. If you have completed the professional ethics and obligations and professional reliance workshops with your current professional organization (as listed above) please ask them to send us an e-mail confirmation as well.

TNRP Member

- Utilize only the designation of TNRP as described in the Foresters Act and ABCFP Bylaws;
- Work with the sponsor to develop a personalized Professional Development Plan as described in Section 5 of the Articling Policy and the Natural Resource Professional Policy (revised January 2014);
- Keep and maintain a practice diary, which records work undertaken and progress towards completion of the Professional Development Plan. Refer to the *Articling Policy* for more details;
- Meet with the sponsor regularly (in person or otherwise) to discuss work undertaken, professional development and the progress towards achieving the Professional Development Plan goals/outcomes;
- · Complete any outstanding requirements for registration; and,
- Prepare for the registration exam.

Sponsor
